- Word Families--They're a group of words that have similar spelling and sound patterns, found at the end of the word. They also rhyme. Write down each word family listed and come up with 5 words (real or nonsense) that belong in that word family.
  - o Example-"-ig" word family: pig, jig, wig, fig, big.

    - -ec
    - -op
- Read these real and nonsense words to an adult.
  - o fat, pad, pag, yam, wat, dag, bad, gax, map, san, sat, tak, had, zat, fan

### **Tuesday (4/28)**

- Narrative Writing--Pretend you got a brand new dog! You are going to write about what you would do with your new dog, using words like 'first, second, last'. Here is an example of a starter sentence for you!
  - I am going to spend a day with my dog. First, \_\_\_\_\_. Second, \_\_\_\_\_.
     Last, \_\_\_\_\_.
- Syllables--Have a family member read to you these words. You will then clap out and count how many syllables each word has.
  - o spider, airplane, doll, football, kite, robot, wagon, yo-yo, car, whistle, top, dinosaur, apple, train, motorcycle, scissors, backpack, alligator, fish, hamburger, barn, bee.
