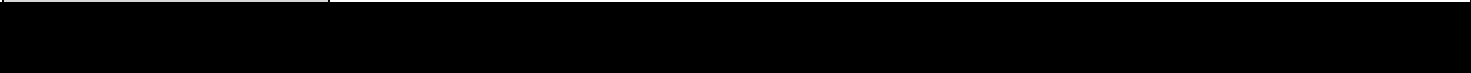
Thursday (1/14): Verbs and Sounds of the letter y review

frequency words correctly and use your spelling strategies when attempting to write unfamiliar words. (1.L.2)



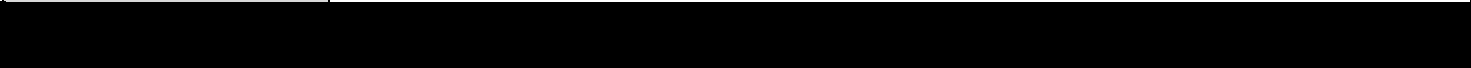

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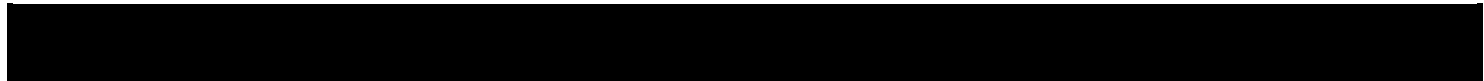
