As you read, keep in mind that many words are related and have different shades of meaning, like happy and elated mean about the same thing, but elated is to a more extreme level. Then, answer the comprehension questions from page 448 on a piece of paper or verbally with a guardian. (2.RL.1, 2.RL.5, 2.RF.3, 2.RF.4, 2.L.1, 2.L.4, 2.L.5, 2.SL.1, 2.SL.3) ☐ Writing: You will write an opinion paper telling about your favorite birthday experience (it can be from your birthday or someone else's). Your opinion piece must include: a. Introduce an opinion about the topic you are writing about. b. Supply reasons that support the opinion. c. Use grade level appropriate linking words to connect the opinion and reasons. d. Provide a concluding statement or section. There is no requirement in length, but it must be detailed enough that your reader won't have any questions after reading it. Some things you may include would be how old you were, who was present, what you did, the food that you ate and why it was your favorite birthday experience. Begin writing your rough draft.
