	Find a stairway in your house or outside. Climb up and down the stairs. As you step up or down, move your voice up and down in pitch to match your motions. As you go up the stairs make your voice go up, as you go down the stairs, make your voice go down.
	☐ Make a stair melody. As you step up or down, make up words to make up a stair melody. Make sure your voice matches the stairs - raise it in pitch as you step up or lower as you step down.

	PRACTICE! Decide on ONE favorite song that you would like to perform on Friday. Practice your song by singing it out loud. See if you can remember all the words. If you can't remember all the words, try looking them up or listening to the song to refresh your memory. *Use your stair memory to practice making sure your voice goes up when the melody goes up, and down when the melody goes down.
