	☐ Day 1: Wayne Thiebaud Lollipop Sculpture: Make salt dough, following the recipe (recipe will make multiple lollipops). The consistency should be like play-doh. If the mixture is too dry, mix in small amounts of water until it is the correct consistency. If the mixture is too wet, mix in small amounts of flour until it is the correct consistency.
	Roll the part dough into a coil, repeat step to make a 2nd coil. then carefully twist the 2 coils together. Finally, wrap the coil into a spiral. Use a pencil to make a small hole near the top of your spiral. Wait 24 hrs for it to air dry or you can bake it in the oven at 200 degrees or 2-3 hours.

	☐ Day 2: Details: Once spirals are dry, add color to your lollipops. You can use markers or paint. Allow to dry.

	☐ Day 3: Finishing touches: glue the back of your spiral to a popsicle stick. For best results, you may want to use a hot glue gun, but elmers works just fine too. Add a string to the top, to make it into an ornament.

	☐ Day 4: Wayne Thiebaud Drawing: use the drawing guides to draw your own Wayne Thiebaud inspired drawing. You have your choice of a gumball machine, cake slice, cupcake, cake or donut. If you want you can do as many as you like.
