LESSON/UNIT: Beg. Reading Skills SUBJECT/GRADE: K-Reading DATES: Sept. 14-18

What do students need to do?	Monday (9/14):
Link to BV Week at a	☐ Watch the BV Week at a Glance instructional video.
Glance instructional video.	☐ This week we will be learning to recognize letters P-S. Cut the lowercase letters out and match to the correct capital letter. Review letter's A-O flashcards.
	Tuesday (9/15):
	☐ We have 2 new sight words! Remember sight words are words that are often seen in stories that we read. <b>Our two new words are 'the' and 'yellow.'</b> Make a paper flashcard for each word. Review previous week's sight words (I, red, am, orange)
	☐ Complete 'the' rainbow write worksheet. Use different colors to write the sight word multiple times in each section of the rainbow! The goal is to write the sight word 2 times in each section.
	☐ Build the sight word 'yellow' multiple times (5) with something from around the house (playdough, legos, toys, toothpicks, cotton balls)
	Wednesday (9/16):
	☐ We are going to be learning about sequence! Sequence is the order of when things happen in a story. It's important that we listen to the sequence of a story so we can better understand what's happening. We use words like first, then, next and last to explain what happened in a story!
	☐ Read one of your favorite books and then complete the Order of Events worksheet.  Make sure to write the title of the story that you read.
	Thursday (9/17):
	☐ Have an adult say these words and listen for the sound at the beginning of the words. Say: pig, play, pond. The sound at the beginning of these words is /p/. Create a list of 5 words that begin with the same sound as <i>pig</i> .
	☐ Have an adult say these words and decide how many syllables there are. (Optional: Build a ladder out of painters tape and jump forward for each syllable)
	☐ Listen to the words: bell, button, ladybug, banana, cow, baby, macaroni, butterfly. How many syllables are in each word?

	☐ Today we are going to be writers. Writers can tell stories through words and pictures. We are going to be telling a story of what we look like through drawing a picture! Answer these questions to help you draw a picture of what you look like.
	☐ What color is your hair?
