	Tuesday (11/3): Science Exploration: Rivers and River Rocks
	☐ In this Mystery Science exploration, students investigate the effects of rocks tumbling in a river. Based on their observations, they construct an explanation for why there is sand at a beach. In the activity, Rocking the River, students pretend to
	be a river and tear up pieces of construction paper to model what happens to rocks as they travel along the river. You will find the full set of instructions to complete the activity (using the River and Draw the River printouts) at the end of the Mystery Science video or transcript.
	☐ Materials needed: River printout, Draw the River Rocks printout, and construction paper (please ask your teacher if you need colored construction paper)
