TRANSPORTATION

Changes to Bus Pass Policy

One of the responses to coping with the 6.6% state aid reduction for next year was to expand the area requiring bus passes and to raise the price of a pass. This is hoped to increase revenues enough to save the equivalent of one teaching position in the district.

Regular bus passes are now required for students who reside within five miles of their attendance center and are priced at \$75 per semester with a family maximum of \$175. This is \$0.43 per ride. Passes purchased more than two weeks before the first day of school, before *August 8th* this year, will have the students scheduled to ride the first day. Passes purchased on *August 8th* or later, before the first day of school, will have students scheduled to ride as of August 29th.

The district also is now requiring an increased bus fee for open enrolled students to compensate for the inefficiencies this busing causes. The fee for open enrolled students is \$150 per semester and the fee does not contribute to the family maximum. Families can avoid the increased fee and purchase a regular bus pass by arranging for their student(s) to be picked up and dropped off at a stop within their attendance center boundary.

For purposes of determining the five-mile distance to school, the transportation department uses the most direct route between the pick up point and the attendance center. If you have a question about bus pass requirements, please call the transportation department at 582-3514 for help.
