TRANSPORTATION

Bus Pass Policy

Regular bus passes are now required for students who reside within five miles of their attendance center and are priced at \$75 per semester with a family maximum of \$175. This is \$0.43 per ride. Passes purchased more than two weeks before the first day of school, before August 7th this year, will have the students scheduled to ride the first day. Passes purchased on August 8th or later, before the first day of school, will have students scheduled to ride as of August 28th.

The district requires a bus fee for open enrolled students. The fee for open enrolled students is \$150 per semester and the fee does not contribute to the family maximum. Families can avoid the increased fee and purchase a regular bus pass by arranging for their student(s) to be picked up and dropped off at a stop within their attendance center boundary.

For purposes of determining the five-mile distance to school, the transportation department uses the most direct route between the pick up point and the attendance center. If you have a question about bus pass requirements, please call the transportation department at 582-3514 for help.
